FIRST MEETING OF NEW MAYORAL FORUM, 2017-19

- Mayors met for the first time since local body elections in October 2016 (the Nov meeting was postponed due to the earthquakes).
- New members are Graham Smith (Mackenzie), Donna Favel (Ashburton), Sam Broughton (Selwyn) and David Bedford (Chair, Environment Canterbury).
- The Forum elected Mayor Lianne Dalziel (Christchurch City) as chairperson, and Mayor Damon Odey (Timaru District) as deputy chairperson.
- Mayoral leads of CREDS work programmes were confirmed:
 - o Regional transport: Winton Dalley
 - o Digital connectivity: Damon Odey
 - o Freshwater management: Cr David Caygill (regional council)
 - Value-added production: Craig Rowley
 - o Education and training: David Ayers
 - o Newcomer settlement: Donna Favel, Sam Broughton
 - o Visitor strategy: Winston Gray, Graham Smith and Sam Broughton.
- The Forum approved a Canterbury local authorities Triennial
 Agreement for 2017–19, which includes a Mayoral Forum Charter of
 Purpose (terms of reference) and mandates the work of the Chief
 Executives Forum. This now goes to member councils for ratification.
- The Forum approved a draft three-year work programme, which is implemented by the Chief Executives Forum.
- The Forum approved a regional submission on the Health
 (Fluoridation of Drinking Water) Amendment Bill that represents the
 views of district councils and Environment Canterbury. The Forum also
 supported a separate submission from Christchurch City, recognising
 the city's unique circumstances.
- Mayors Gray and Dalley shared information and reflected on earthquake response and recovery planning in Kaikōura and Hurunui, and expressed appreciation for the support provided by other councils.
- The Forum, with support from central government, has contracted Interbrand NZ to research and develop a Canterbury brand story to attract businesses, capital, workers, students and visitors to our region. Interbrand presented a draft story, which was warmly endorsed by Mayors. Interbrand will present a final story to Mayors and the CREDS reference group at a workshop on 23 February 2017.
