CANTERBURY POLICY FORUM

The Canterbury Policy Forum met on 6 April 2018 and discussed:

- the recently released Mackenzie Basin: Opportunities for agency alignment report – a collaboration between Environment Canterbury, Mackenzie and Waitaki District Councils, Department of
 - Conservation, and Land Information New Zealand. The report aims to improve agency effectiveness and strategic focus, achieve better environmental outcomes, and improve



- capacity to meet the needs and interests of the Basin's communities, stakeholders and rūnanga
- Mana Whakahono ā Rohe and Iwi participation arrangements under the Resource Management Act
- priorities for the coming year, including how the Policy Forum can best support councils and other regional forums, and scanning of upcoming central government initiatives that may affect Canterbury
- a draft immigration and international education discussion document prepared for the Canterbury Mayoral Forum as a basis for engagement with central government officials and Ministers
- update on the Canterbury Earthquakes: Whole of Recovery Symposium planned for November 2018
- updates from the Canterbury Planning Managers, Climate Change, and Compliance, Monitoring and Enforcement working groups
